

Knot Tying Reference SWAPS Mini Booklet

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To make 16 SWAPS, you will need to print one copy of Front Covers (p.2), one copy of Back Covers (p.4), and 8 copies of Inner Page (p.3). I recommend printing the covers on cardstock for durability, but the inner pages can be printed on regular printer paper.

Cut along the lines and sort into booklets. Each booklet has eight inner pages. The first two rows on the Inner page are the pages to one booklet, and the second two rows are the pages to another booklet. Make sure your stack is lined up and then punch a hole in the upper left corner of the pages. Because this is a thicker booklet, you may need to do this in batches, as your hole punch likely will not be able to punch through that many sheets at once.

Once your hole is punched, secure the pages together using a Larks Head knot with yarn or embroidery floss. You can then embellish as desired. Don't forget to top it off with a pin!

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














<p>The Overhand Knot</p> <p>Use when only a simple knot is needed.</p> 	<p>The Half Hitch</p> <p>Use to fasten a rope to a ring or tent stake</p> 	<p>The Sheepshank</p> <p>Use to shorten a length of rope</p> 	<p>The Square Knot</p> <p>Use to join two cords that are the same thickness.</p> 
<p>The Bowline</p> <p>Use to make a loop that won't slip</p> 	<p>The Sheetbend</p> <p>Use to tie a thinner cord to a thicker cord</p> 	<p>The Larks Head</p> <p>Use to loop a cord around a ring</p> 	<p>The Tautline Hitch</p> <p>Use to make a loop that will slip</p> 
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
